

New! How to sign up for those secret AIP classes

Well, maybe the classes aren't exactly *secret*. But they are very interesting and a little hard to find.

Our department – Anthropology and Interdisciplinary Programs – is now using a new system for listing many of our classes. These classes are listed under “bucket” titles like **WS 39100: Advanced Topics in Women's and Gender Studies**. Underneath this title and course number, you can find four actual classes:

WS 39100 – 19903, Post Trauma Recovery

WS 39100 – 24483, Disaster Capitalism and Creative Community Resistance

WS 39100 – 24486, The Monstrous Body: Blackness, Power, and Representation

WS 39100 – 38136, LGBTQ World History

You can take one or more of these classes in the same semester. And you can take one of these classes this semester and then take another one of the classes in a future semester. (You can take classes with the WS 39100 number up to **ten times** while you are an undergrad here.)

The “bucket titles” usually have names like “Special Topics” or “Advanced Topics.” If you see a name like this, then you know that one or more specific courses are hidden underneath it. And you have to go looking!

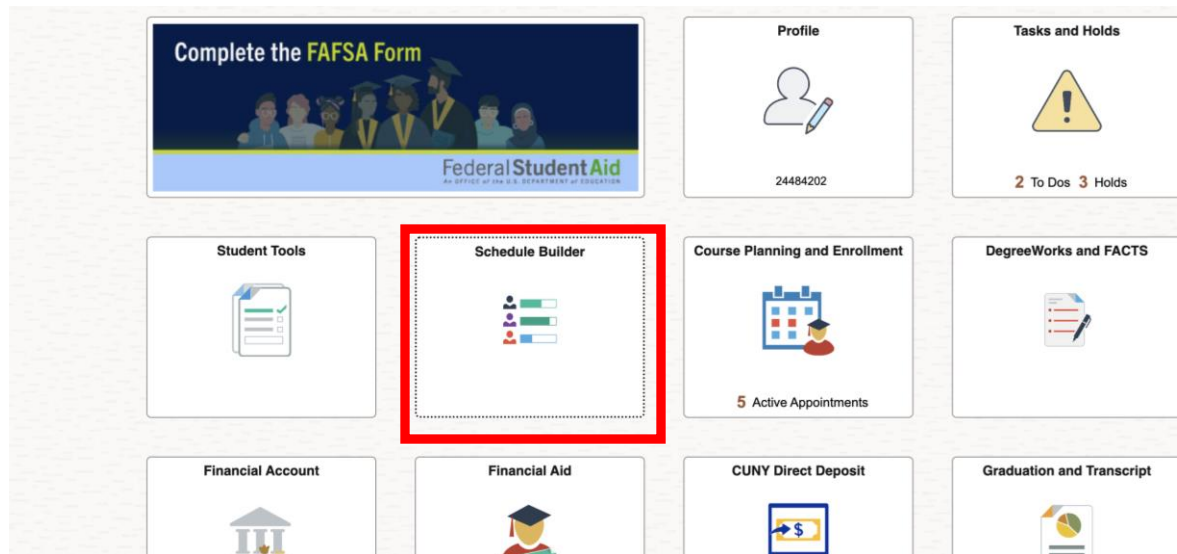

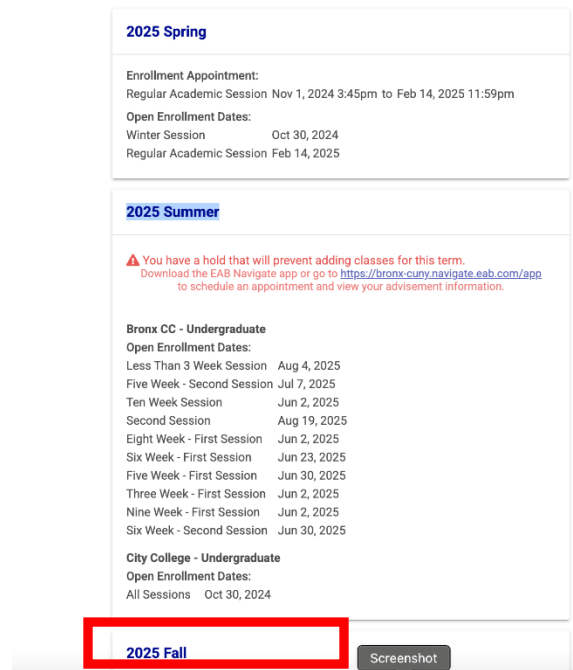

19903-LEC: An in-depth look at the causes and effects of trauma through incarceration/reentry, domestic/intimate partner violence, police brutality, grief, substance abuse and how to begin the process of healing.
24483-LEC: This course will explore the role of states and societies living through natural and human-made disasters. We will draw on insights from global and local communities that have survived disasters and are resisting historical and economic trauma.
